**JOHN STRICKLAND** has been fascinated by words, images, and sounds for as long as he can remember. He graduated from Wabash College as an English major, then received an M.A. in writing from Goddard College. After college, he taught high school English and coached football in Indiana for 33 years. During this time, his interest in jazz and image making, primarily painting, grew. Though he no longer writes, he finds that the disciplines of art, music and writing nourish each other.

In his lecture Strickland will speak about painting as problem solving, and the very specific methods and techniques he is using, drawing heavily on comparisons with music and poetry.
